The Children we invite to our shows face many challenges. Some have physical disabilities or learning difficulties. Others have life limiting illnesses or are living in refuges. For all of them life is a struggle and few ever have the chance to experience a live show such as ours.

The Donated Ticket Scheme is a valuable aspect of our work and truly changes lives. As part of the scheme, 8 year old Owen attended the show at Riverside Park in Southampton in May 2011.

Owen suffers from autism and global development delay (GDD). Children with GDD have not reached key developmental milestones such as motor skills and cognitive skills and social skills. Owen has severe learning difficulties and struggles with speech and language in particular. He finds it hard to follow conversations and has to have one to one tuition at school.

Owen visited Circus Starr in with his family and was delighted to meet his hero, Spiderman, and also loved the clowns Duo Delbosq.

Owen's mum, Wendy said "We struggle to find activities that the whole family will enjoy and the trip to see Circus Starr certainly fitted the bill. It was great to see Owen sitting on the edge of his seat and interacting with the performers, laughing at the clowns, especially when they poured popcorn all over his dad!"
